## Thursday 26 February

### Yid-Ee Goh (violin) and Lisa Chou (piano)

Long-term friends of our series Yid-Ee and Lisa present a quite different style of recital. This programme was conceived as a "live" Classical Mix Tape, where items flow continuously from one to another. Expect music by Bach, de Falla, Mozart, Pärt, Beethoven, Gluck, Clara and Robert Schumann, and Debussy, bound together in a seamless presentation by these superb artists.



## Thursday 5 March

### Passione Quartet

This vibrant, youthful quartet has benefited from mentorship by leading musicians, including intensive coaching from the New Zealand String Quartet and the Australian String Quartet in Adelaide, and is a current participant in the Auckland Philharmonia Aspiring Musicians Programme. Schubert's Lyrical String Quartet No. 15, the last he composed, is the centrepiece of their programme.

## Thursday 26 March

### Vivo Duo - violin and piano/accordion

Assistant Concertmaster of the Auckland Philharmonia, Miranda Adams is very well-known to audiences throughout the country. In this programme she is joined by duo partner Tatiana Lanchtchikova who plays piano and accordion. Their programme opens with Beethoven's 10th Violin Sonata and moves to Brahms and Kreisler, and then to Tangos by Piazzolla.
